As technology advances, more and more, people are removed from their jobs as machines are replacing people in some routine jobs. As health care improves, more and more people reach the retirement age. Aged people share with the active youthful population the few resources that are available. This is already a cause for concern since youths are advocating that old people ought to hand everything over to them whereas the older people think they should hang on a little longer since there is no great hope for them when they retire.

People have tried to secure their retirement in various ways. First, we can save part of what we earn to take care of the dry years when the time comes. This has proved not to be a very sure means of preparing for the future because of mismanagement by most of our financial institution. It is easy to come up with a long list of names of people who have died from heart attacks because once retired, they could not get back the money they had saved. Nevertheless, this still remains one of the best options to prepare for retirement especially for those who are self employed.

There are other ways through which we can provide for more secured revenue. One of these concerns the principal underlying government pension plans. This is generally known as "pas-a you-go" system. According to this system, the government taxes incomes to pay pensions. These people give part of the income they earn in the form of taxes and gain it back later in the form of pension. Since the working age population in most industrial countries will soon have to support a larger number of retired people, there is growing fear that the government may not be able to maintain this system successfully.

The other option is generally used in Africa and most developing countries where family ties are still strong. Parents invest in their children and rely on these kids to take care of them when they are old instead of children sending their old parents to homes where unknown people take care of them.
