**I./ Réaction à un texte écrit**

**A./ Contexte** : Quand les catastrophes surviennent les organisations d'aide humanitaire et les personnes de bonne volonté se manifestent pour porter main forte aux victimes.

**B./ Support**

**Text:**

- 1- The notion of people helping each other is central to the harmonious existence of mankind. Every single inhabitant of planet earth should learn to give their fellow creatures a helping hand when necessary. Unfortunately, not everybody understands it. Some people or organizations view such a situation as an opportunity to take unfair advantage from. For instance, aid in the form of a loan to a government can have crippling consequences if high interest rates have to be paid on the money borrowed. Paying back a loan can impoverish a country.
- 2- In October 1984, Bob Geldof saw TV pictures of starving people in Ethiopia. Like millions of other people, he was horrified. If he had had a lot of money, he would have given it, but he didn't have much money. What could he do?
- 3- Bob Geldof was a pop singer and decided to ask other pop singers to help him. Geldof wanted to make a record with a lot of famous singers and give the money for famine relief. But he thought it would be very difficult because it was a new idea. He was surprised when famous singers and groups like Sting, Phil Collins and Duran Duran said they would help. If they sold enough records perhaps they would make £100,000.

Through many difficulties, they finally made the recording (the song was called "Do they know it's Christmas?") on Sunday November 25th. and the finished record was ready on 26th! It was a fantastic success and by January they had more than £5,000,000.

- 4- But when Geldof visited Ethiopia, he saw that more was needed. Much more! Perhaps if he organized an international concert, they would make more money. That was much more difficult than the record, but Geldof worked 20 hours a day to organize it. Finally,



on July 13th 1985 Live Aid, the biggest concert in the world, began in London (England), Philadelphia (USA) and in Melbourne (Australia).

- 5- More than 200,000 people attended the concerts and two billion people (that is 2,000,000,000) watched them on television. The performers included the most famous singers and groups in the world, from Tina Turner and Mick Jagger to Madonna and McCartney. And the money to help starving people in Ethiopia, Sudan, Mali and Chad began to arrive by the end of the year. They had more than 100 million dollars.
- 6- Today, the food situation in some African countries is very difficult. If the aid agencies had more money, they would be able to help more. Perhaps we should remember the words of an International Commission worker: "Only Africans can devise solutions for problems of Africa".
